NH Welcomes New Superintendent Rick Johnson

I would like to welcome you back for another exciting year at North Harrison R-III School! The school year is rapidly approaching. The first day of school for students is Wednesday, August 20th. The building looks great! Danny and Becky Lisle have been very busy this summer preparing the classrooms and the hallways for another school year.

There will be three bus routes for the school year 2014-15. Bus #1 will primarily pick up East of I-35. Bus #2 will make pickups south and west of Eagleville, including Hwy M. Bus #3 will pick up students in the Hatfield area and north of Eagleville. Each bus will also be picking up some students in the city of Eagleville. The drivers will be driving the routes during the week of August 11-15 to get an estimated pick up times. You may contact your driver or the school August 15th or 16th to get an estimated pick up time. Please allow at least 10 minutes before and after your pick up time until routes are established and pick up and drop off times become consistent. We are usually able to push pick up times back a few minutes once we have driven the routes for a few weeks.

The early dismissal time will be 12:45. This is a change from last year. Our school calendar has 170 student attendance days, with 12 days in which students will be dismissed early for teacher in-services or other reasons. If we dismiss early due to weather to weather, we will try to make it to the 12:45 dismissal time. This year’s school calendar also includes a full day off on Wednesday before Thanksgiving, and a Spring Break from March 16-20. Make-up days are scheduled for Jan. 19, Feb. 16, April 6, and May 20, 21, 22, 25. Please listen to local radio stations such as KAAN FM 95.5, or check the school web page for school cancellations due to inclement weather.

The Board of Education and staff at North Harrison R-III continue their efforts to provide the best educational experience for every student in the district. All parents are encouraged to get to know their child’s teacher, and to develop a positive working relationship. Only when we all work together can we truly provide the best experience for our students. If you have a question or concern, I encourage you to contact the teacher first. Most concerns can be resolved through communication between you and the teacher.

BUS ROUTES

If you are new to our school district or have relocated, please call our office to ensure pick-up. Families within one mile of the school building must pay \$30 for the first students and \$15 for each additional student in the household, for bus service. In addition the board allows elementary children in 3rd grade and below to ride free of charge if they must cross one of our major highways (Highway N and/or Highway 69) to get to school. Payment is expected at the time of approval. Approval will be granted only if there is space available.

Student Insurance Coverage

If you should need affordable accidental injury insurance coverage for your student (Pre-K through 12th grade), the school has coverage available through K & K Insurance Group. Coverage is available for as little as \$28 for the entire school year. They also offer plan options. The company will notify NH of the plan purchased. Claim forms may be picked up at Lisa Gibson's office as needed. A packet is needed for each child and will be distributed with each Student Handbook or you may pick one up at one of our offices. You may purchase coverage at any time during the school year!
A student MUST have proof of insurance for try-outs, practice, or participation in cheerleading, basketball, softball, or track.

Available in each Student Handbook is eligibility and enrollment information for MO HealthNet for Kids, Missouri's Health Insurance Program.

Career Center Students

North Harrison students will attend North Central Career Center in Bethany during the afternoon session. The bus will leave NH at approximately 11:40am.; loading and unloading at the south entrance of the school building. The students will share a ride with Lamoni, riding on their bus. It is anticipated that the bus will return to Eagleville at approximately 2:30pm.

The first day for students to attend classes at NCCC will be Wednesday, August 20.

NH students MAY or may NOT attend classes at NCCC on days NH has early dismissals; this is their option.

Dual Credit Coures Offered to Qualifying NH Students

NH students can get a jump on their college education earning college credit while enrolled in our high school classes. Students must meet the qualifications outlined by the sponsoring college.
The student is responsible for payment of \$50 per credit hour (\$150 per 3 hour course, per semester). The North Harrison School District will cover the remaining cost. The fee is due with the Dual Credit Enrollment Form and is payable by post-dated checks to North Harrison School District, which will be receipted on the day indicated. Those not presenting payment may still enroll in the course; however, the work will be for high school credit only.
Courses offered as Dual Credit Classes this school year include French taught by Mrs. Cracraft, College Algebra and College Trigonometry taught by Mr. Mecca, College English and Speech taught by Mrs. Rivera, Government and American History taught by Mrs. Percell, and Biology proctored by Mrs. Stoll. Cooperating universities include North Central Missouri College in Trenton, Truman State University in Kirksville, and Missouri Western State University in St. Joe.
Enrollment/Registration Forms and PAYMENT for these courses will be completed during REGISTRATION!

Senate Bill 16 requires that all students beginning kindergarten or attending North Harrison for the first time as a 1st grader have a comprehensive eye exam by an eye doctor. Your eye care specialist will have the necessary form. They can fax it to us at 660-867-5214 or you can return it to the school.

After School Activity Notes

Notes are required to excuse a child in grades PS-6 from riding the bus home or to permit the child to leave for a destination other than home. These notes must be in the office by 8:30 am the day of the changed destination or the child will go to their normal after school location. No changes can be made after 12:00 pm unless an extreme emergency arises. Any student staying after school for clubs or activities must have a note from home each time giving them permission to stay.



Parents will have ten (10) school days after the annual public notice to view the student’s “Directory Information” and to provide notice in writing to the school district that they choose to not have this information or any portion of the “Directory Information” released, understanding the student will not be included in public releases, including but not limited to the school yearbook. Unless notified to the contrary in writing within the ten (10) school day period, the school district may disclose any of those items designated as “Directory Information” without the parent’s or eligible student’s prior written consent including in print and electronic publications of the school district. The final day to give North Harrison School District written notification will be Thursday, September 4, 2014 Parents may also indicate by this deadline that they do NOT give permission for their student to participate in anonymous surveys required by Safe & Drug-Free Schools and Communities.





New Meal Pattern

The new school meal guidelines announced by the USDA in 2012 continue to be phased in per the required implementation timeline. Beginning school year 2014-2015:

- Graduated sodium limits — phase in target level 1 of 3
- Whole grains — all grains offered must be 100% whole grain rich
- Fruits — minimum of 1 cup of fruit must be offered at breakfast
- Breakfast meals — must contain ½ cup fruit or vegetable on the tray
- A la carte competitive food rules — first year of implementation is 2014-15

Menus and a la carte offerings will continue to be constructed so they appeal to students and exceed the requirements so we remain in total compliance well ahead of the required schedules.

Extra Entrée – Extra Milk

All Students, at an extra cost, can purchase an additional entrée or milk offered as part of the school lunch program. For example if a student wants a second entrée, or an additional entrée, like a slice of pizza, then that entrée can be selected in the lunch line and charged to the student's account. Extra entrees are only sold to students who first purchase a school lunch. Again, all students can have extra servings of canned fruit, fresh fruit, vegetables, salads, at no charge. All extra servings of these items are free. If a student is free or reduced they may receive one entrée with their meal but they must have money in their account to purchase any extra entrees.

Snacks

For High School students, snack items will be available during the lunch period. Snack items offered include: Fruit drinks, ice cream, snack mixes like Chex mix, a variety of chips, beef jerky, yogurt and granola bars. All snacks meet standards set by the district wellness policy.

School Lunch Account

The District's Lunch Account Policy for the 2014-2015 School year is located in the Student handbook. The District allows students to charge up to \$12.00. When an account balance is low, students receive a minimum of three reminders to bring lunch money. At this point, when an account reaches a negative \$12.00 all charges will stop. If the student is a free student they still will be able to purchase a school lunch, but no extra entrées will be allowed.

A Point of Sale (POS) software system is used for the school lunch program. Please note the following important information:

- Each student will have his/her own individual Student Account.
- If sending cash with a student, place in a sealed envelope, along with the student's name and lunch account number. We are not responsible for lost, unidentified, or stolen cash.
- Deposits should be turned in by 9:00 a.m. at the student's school.

Lunch Account Deposits must be made before school starts. Because we receive an overwhelming amount of deposits the morning of the first day of school, we cannot guarantee that we will be able to input all deposits into accounts before the lunch period begins. To insure that your deposit is credited to your student's lunch account on the first day of school, please send your first deposit, for each student in your family, to the address below:

Be sure to include your name, your student's name, and your student's lunch account number. Also include any changes in your address or telephone number.

Free and Reduced Applications can be picked-up at the District Administration Building, or are available at the school website on the "Food Service" page. All students will be at Paid status on the first day of school, unless the Free & Reduced application has been received and approved prior to the first day of school.

Outside Food and Beverage

The District does not allow the delivery of food or beverages from outside vendors or fast food establishments for a student's breakfast or lunch meal. All meals are to be provided by the District's School Food Service or a prepared meal from home may be sent with your student. No soda pop is allowed during the breakfast and lunch serving times.

Diet Modifications

Families are responsible for notifying the School Food Service if their child requires a diet modification because of a life threatening disability. A licensed physician must provide specific written medical documentation. Please contact Kendra at 660-254-8655 for more information.
