Greetings from Superintendent Johnson

Welcome back to another exciting year at North Harrison R-III School! The school year is rapidly approaching. The first day for students is Wednesday, August 19. We are in the final stages of preparing the building. Danny and Becky Lisle are putting the final touches on the classrooms and hallways, and the building looks great! We are nearing completion of an expansion project of our music room to accommodate the increasing number of students in our music classes.

If you drop off or pick up students in the elementary parking lot, you will notice that we have established a stop sign at our cross walk. This is in response to concerns of student safety while loading and unloading. We ask that you enter the parking lot to the right of the stop sign and circle the lot to exit. We will send your students out as you pull up to the curb to load. All traffic in the elementary parking lot is one-way traffic. We will continue with three bus routes for the school year 2015-16. Bus #1 will pick up students who live east of I-35, as well as some students in Eagleville. Bus #2 will make pickups south and west of Eagleville. Bus #3 will pick up students in the Hatfield area and north of Eagleville. You may contact your driver during the week of August 10-14 to get an estimated pick-up time. Please allow 10 – 15 minutes before and after your pick-up and drop-off times until the routes are established.

Our early dismissal time will be 12:45. If we dismiss early due to weather conditions, we will try to make it to the 12:45 dismissal time. Please listen to local radio stations such as KAAN FM 95.5, or sign up for Farmers Bank Connection for school cancellations. You may also check the school web page for school cancellations and other school information.

The Board of Education and staff at North Harrison R-III continue their efforts to provide the best educational experience for every student in the district. I encourage you to be involved in your child's education by getting to know your child's teachers, and develop a positive working relationship. Open and honest communication between the teacher and home is the most important factor to ensure a positive educational experience for your child.

Update to Courses Listed on the "Weighted Scale"

The criteria used at North Harrison to give a course "Weighted Class" status has been updated. Courses earning the "weighted" status are those considered above the high school regimen and classes taught for college credit. Courses on this list beginning with the 2015-16 school year include: Chemistry, Anatomy, Physiology, and classes taken for college credit. They are marked with a "#" sign on the students grade card and transcript.

Classes complying will have the grade point earned multiplied by 1.3. (For example, earning an "A" in a non-weighted class would amount to a 4.0 gpa, while earning an "A" in a weighted class would earn a 5.2 gpa.)

Several courses have now been REMOVED from the "weighted scale" beginning with the 2015-16 school year. So, if you're comparing a 2015-16 gpa to a past student taking the same course you will notice a difference.

Our administration feels this change will more accurately reflect the rigorous work needed for these advanced level courses.

Career Center Students

North Harrison students will attend North Central Career Center in Bethany during the afternoon session. The bus will leave NH at approximately 11:40am.; loading and unloading at the south entrance of the school building. It is anticipated that the bus will return to Eagleville at approximately 2:30pm.

The first day for students to attend classes at NCCC will be Monday, August 24.

NH students MAY or may NOT attend classes at NCCC on days NH has early dismissals; this is their option.

Dual Credit Coures Offered to Qualifying NH Students

NH students can get a jump on their college education earning college credit while enrolled in our high school classes. Students must meet the qualifications outlined by the sponsoring college.

The student is responsible for payment of \$50 per credit hour (\$150 per 3 hour course, per semester). The North Harrison School District will cover the remaining cost. The fee is due with the Dual Credit Enrollment Form and is payable by post-dated checks to North Harrison School District, which will be receipted on the day indicated. Those not presenting payment may still enroll in the course; however, the work will be for high school credit only.

Courses offered as Dual Credit Classes this school year include College Algebra and College Trigonometry taught by Mr. Mecca, College English taught by Mrs. Rivera, Government and American History taught by Mrs. Percell, and Biology proctored by Mrs. Stoll. Cooperating institutions include North Central Missouri College in Trenton, Truman State University in Kirksville, and Missouri Western State University in St. Joe.

Enrollment/Registration Forms and PAYMENT for these courses will be completed during REGISTRATION!

Notes are required to excuse a child in grades PS-6 from riding the bus home or to permit the child to leave for a destination other than home. These notes must be in the office by 8:30 am the day of the changed destination or the child will go to their normal after school location. No changes can be made after 12:00 pm unless an extreme emergency arises. Any student staying after school for clubs or activities must have a note from home each time giving them permission to stay.




School Lunch Account

The District's Lunch Account Policy for the 2015-16 School year is located in the Student handbook. The District allows students to charge up to \$12.00. When an account balance is low, students receive a minimum of three reminders to bring lunch money. At this point, when an account reaches a negative \$12.00 all charges will stop. If the student is a free student they still will be able to purchase a school lunch, but no extra entrées will be allowed.

- Deposits should be turned in by 9:00 a.m. at the student's school.

Because we receive an overwhelming amount of deposits the morning of the first day of school, we cannot guarantee that we will be able to input all deposits into accounts before the lunch period begins. 


