## SCHOOL START AND DISMISSAL TIMES FOR 2017-18 and LUNCH SERVICE TIMES FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS!

New this year....These times are for 7th—12th grade students and their parents.

All past due accounts must be paid in full at registration.

Directory Information" is information contained in an education record of a student that would not generally be considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if disclosed. The school district designates the following items as "Directory Information": student's name, parent's name, address, telephone number, electronic mail address, date and place of birth, grade level, major field of study, enrollment status (e.g. full-time or part-time), participation in officially recognized activities and sports including audiovisual and photographic records of the openly visible activities thereof (e.g., artistic performances, sporting contests, assemblies, service projects, awards ceremonies, etc.), weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees, honors and awards received, most recent previous school attended and photograph including photographs of regular school activities that do not disclose specific academic information about the child and/or would not be considered harmful or an invasion of

privacy. Parents will have ten (10) school days after the annual public notice to view the student's "Directory Information" and to provide notice in writing to the school district that they choose to not have this information or any portion of the "Directory Information" released, understanding the student will not be included in public releases, including but not limited to the school yearbook. Unless notified to the contrary in writing within the ten (10) school day period, the school district may disclose any of those items designated as "Directory Information" without the parent's or eligible student's prior written consent including in print and electronic publications of the school district. The final day to give North Harrison School District written notification will be Tuesday, August 30, 2016. Parents may also indicate by this deadline that they do NOT give permission for their student to participate in anonymous surveys required by Safe & Drug-Free Schools and Communities.

#### **Welcome to Preschool: A Letter From Miss Rose**

I'd like to take a few moments to introduce myself. My name is Rose Waldeier, but please feel free to call me Miss Rose. This year begins my my fourth year at North Harrison. #### **Talking About Preschool**

For example, if you drive by a playground, you can mention that at preschool, there will also be a playground. This will help give your child something to look forward to.

#### Morning and Bedtime Routines

Routines provide children with a sense of reassurance and belonging, as well as establishing good school year habits. They also allow parents and children to connect on a regular basis. An early morning routine may include getting dressed, eating breakfast, brushing teeth, and preparing belongings for the day. A bedtime routine may include taking a bath, changing into pajamas, reading a bedtime story, adding closure to the day and allowing your child to settle down.

#### Visiting Preschool/Back to School Night

Visiting the preschool classroom, being introduced to the teacher, and having the opportunity to explore the classroom's learning materials will help ease your child into the transition of a new school year. North Harrison will be holding its Back to School Night August 21, from 6:00-7:30pm. 

Students going into 12th grade are required to have 2nd dose of Meningococcal vaccines, unless the 1st dose was administered to a student who was 16 years of age or older, in which case only one dose shall be required. During fourth quarter of the 2016-17 school year, our Freshman received Chromebooks to do their school work on. Each Chromebook came with a case and charger. These Chromebooks were received with the understanding that each student was responsible for the one assigned to them. With that responsibility they had to take them home each night to charge, make sure it was brought to school each day, and the overall daily care of each Chromebook.

These same returning Sophomores will be receiving the Chromebooks back this year. Each student was assigned a specific Chromebook to them and will get the same device again this year.

There will be a one-time insurance fee associated with the Chromebook of \$15.00 for one student or \$25.00 for two or more students.

Replacement costs for missing or damaged items are as follows: Chromebook-\$200.00, case-\$15.00, charger or charging cord-\$15.00.

We will be implementing the Chromebooks with this year's Freshman. At this time we do not know when the Chromebooks will be in, but there will be a \$15.00 deposit at the time students receive them.

## Dual Credit Courses Offered to Qualifying NH Students

NH students can get a jump on their college education earning college credit while enrolled in our high school classes. Students must meet the qualifications outlined by the sponsoring college.

The student is responsible for payment of \$60 per credit hour (\$180 per 3 hour course, per semester). The North Harrison School District will cover the remaining cost. The fee is due with the Dual Credit Enrollment Form on or before August 4th and is payable by post-dated checks to North Harrison School District, which will be receipted on the day indicated. Those not presenting payment may still enroll in the course; however, the work will be for high school credit only.

Courses offered as Dual Credit Classes this school year include College Algebra taught by Mr. Mecca, College English taught by Mrs. Rivera, Government and American History taught by Mrs. Percell, and Biology proctored by Dr. Hall. Online Dual Credit Classes can be selected on an individual bases. Cooperating institutions include North Central Missouri College in Trenton, Northwest Missouri State University in Maryville, and Missouri Western State University in St. Joe. This year we will be offering yearlong college algebra taught through Northwest and students enrolled in that class will be provided with a Northwest Missouri State issued laptop computer to use throughout the school year. Enrollment/Registration Forms and PAYMENT for these courses will be completed during REGISTRATION!

#### **Annual Notification of Directory Information**

Directory Information" is information contained in an education record of a student that would not generally be considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if disclosed. The school district designates the following items as "Directory Information": student's name, parent's name, address, telephone number, electronic mail

Parents will have ten (10) school days after the annual public notice to view the student's "Directory Information" and to provide notice in writing to the school district that they choose to not have this information or any portion of the "Directory Information" released, understanding the student will not be included in public releases, including but not limited to the school yearbook. Unless notified to the contrary in writing within the ten (10) school day period, the school district may disclose any of those items designated as "Directory Information" without the parent's or eligible student's prior written consent including in print and electronic publications of the school district. The final day to give North Harrison School District written notification will be Tuesday, August 30, 2016. Parents may also indicate by this deadline that they do NOT give permission for their student to participate in anonymous surveys required by Safe & Drug-Free Schools and Communities.
