



### Mmm' Good! New Meal Program in Action!

The North Harrison students are consuming a much greater variety and quantity of fresh fruits and vegetables with the signing of Lunchtime Solutions as the food service management company beginning February 1. The food service staff members are now employees of Lunchtime Solutions., a company based in South Dakota. Kim Costen is the Food Service Director. She has been on-site daily to provide on the job training to the staff, demonstrate methods and answer staff questions. Later she will be in the kitchen two days per week doing paperwork and introducing the prep of new menu items. Monica Wilson has over 20 years food service experience and is a new hire for the NH kitchen. Her primary job being care of the "all you can eat fruit and vegetable" self-serve food bar. Cyndi Owens is employed as Kitchen Manager assisting Ms. Costen with the daily operation and paperwork. Cyndi prepares all of the primary entrees (choices A and B on the menus) and the after-school snacks. Peggy Thomsen whips up the sub sandwiches, salads, and the hot vegetables. She commented that she has learned new prep and service techniques and is enjoying the experience. Rosetta Parkhurst is the head baker, washes the dishes by hand and machine and assists the other workers as needed. Ashley

Rinehart was hired for the position of Nurse to begin second semester and works in the cafeteria as well. Ashley checks each breakfast and lunch tray at the point of sale, making certain the student has appropriate amounts of each component to meet the requirement for state funding reimbursement. She charges the students automated account and enters any ala carte purchases made by students or staff. A wide variety of nutritious items are available for purchase in addition to the first-meal charge. Items include for example, yogurt, cookies, sun chips, corn nuts and a variety of ice cream products ranging in price from 50 cents to \$1.75 each. Students in grades 7 through 12 may purchase an extra entrée for \$1.60 each.

The kindergarten through fifth grade students may choose from two lunch entrees, while those in grade 6 through 12 have a third offering.

Cory Thurman said "there is a better selection of food available." Lance Ward said everything is "delicious"! Breann Bennett and Blake Emig are enjoying more fresh veggi choices. Heather Musser commented that there is a wider variety of new choices but a larger lunch bill. Colton Castleberry said he likes the new choices but he doesn't like the extra cost. His parents pay for his meal but he must use his own money for ala carte items.

Two neighboring school districts have stopped by see the new program in action while another has inquired.

## Safety Committee Addresses Needs Through Out the Facility

“Emergency Procedures for North Harrison R-III School District” pamphlets are readily available near the entrance of each classroom and office through out the facility. The flip chart holds step-by-step instructions for staff and students in the event of a situation such as an earthquake, tornado, fire, intruder and multiple other events.

This is just one of the many steps the North Harrison administration takes to keep the students and staff safe each day.

The “Safety Committee” meets periodically to discuss issues and tour the facility looking for concerns that need to be addressed.

Grand River Mutual is currently in the

process of installing a new multi-function notification system through out the facility. This includes an upgrade to the intercom paging system and the addition of speakers in the hallways, cafeteria, gymnasium, multi-purpose room, Early Childhood Center and the elementary playground.

Midwest Digital Systems will install video surveillance cameras through out the buildings.

The North Harrison staff was a captive audience during an excellent intruder response and intervention training led by Straregos, International, a Grandview, Missouri based company. The clinicians spoke to

employees of the North Harrison, South Harrison, Ridgeway, Cainsville, Tri-County, Gilman City, and Spickard School Districts as well as area law enforcement and emergency response teams. The goal of the event was to train principles and techniques of response to an emergency. The participants then tested what had been taught in a realistic simulation.

The North Harrison Safety Committee members are building principals Mike Schmidli and Jan Polley, staff members Brandon Craig, Gayla Pottorff, and Aaron Long, school board members Kirk Emig and Jason Gibson, community member Tommy Gilliland, and Harrison County Sheriff Josh Eckerson.

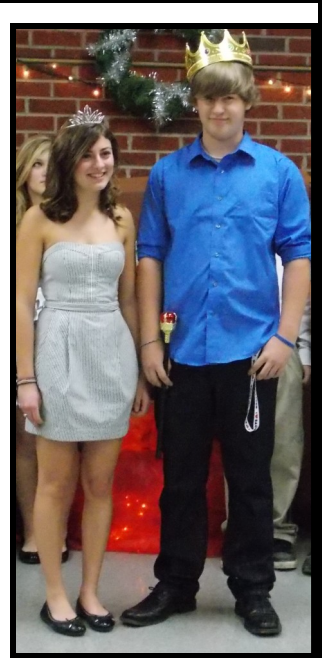

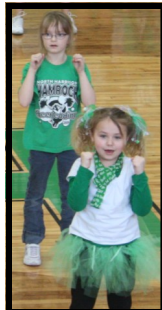
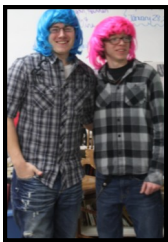
#### 2013 Homecoming Royalty King Garren Gibson and Queen Samantha Rinehart

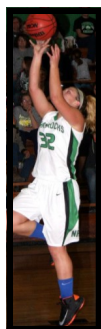
## Shamrocks on the Hardwood by Garren Gibson
