Greetings from Superintendent Johnson

It is hard to believe that the second quarter of the school year 2016-17 has already started. As a young student in high school I remember being impatient to graduate. My father said, "Don't wish your life away. As you get older the years go by much faster." This is another one of those times that he was right.

I wanted to talk a little about a couple of projects. Previously I spoke about the track project we are entering into with the city and the booster club. We have applied for a grant from the Department of Natural Resources. This grant is a 45%-55% matching grant, which means that we put up 55% of the cost, whether that is cash or in-kind donations, and the Federal Government would match 45% of our total. We were told that we would receive an award letter in October if we were selected for funding. As of the printing of this newsletter, we have not received any notification. We cannot move forward with any work until that notice is received. We want to thank everyone who has contributed, and we will publicly announce the status of the grant once it is received.

The second project is one that the District is in the research stage. Our HVAC system is failing. The existing system is 23 years old. Many of our classroom units are requiring annual repairs, and some are no longer in a repairable condition. The library roof is in need of replacement, and several windows need to be replaced. In some parts of the building, the air quality is not within a desirable range. We have had two separate individual energy audits completed on the K-12 building, and will be considering proposals to address these issues. This will be paid for with a lease purchase. We are in the final two years of lease payments on the work done to the high school roof, the gym floor, and the drop ceiling and lighting upgrades. Our goal would be to pay for this out of district funds by extending the existing lease. If you have any questions regarding this project, please feel free to contact me. I will keep you updated as we move forward with this project.


Friday Night Lights




Ashton Hall




