

4-4 The French and Indian War

1. Read Chapter 4, Section 4.

Students will then individually identify the five most important events in the section.

They will then rank their choices in order of importance one through five.

2. Pairs will create a statue, plaque, or monument commemorating a person (or an event) in the section. Possible topics may include British soldiers killed under the leadership of General Braddock, George Washington, the Battle of Quebec, William Pitt, or Chief Pontiac.

3. Victory or loss in war often hinges on the actions, or inactions, of a single leader. Find at least 4 examples of these leaders in your book, and describe each.

Chapter 4 culminating activity

Students will be placed into four groups. Each group will be assigned a specific section from Chapter 4. Once they have their assignment, the group will list the main topics and ideas in the section.

Each group will then be divided so that each person has a specific topic within the section in which he/she will cover. Group members will write a short report about their assigned material.

As a class, a display will be created in which the students place their reports. The reports will be placed in the order that they are listed in the chapter.

This activity is worth 3 separate grades. One grade will be for the main topics and ideas, one grade for the individual reports, and one grade for the display.
