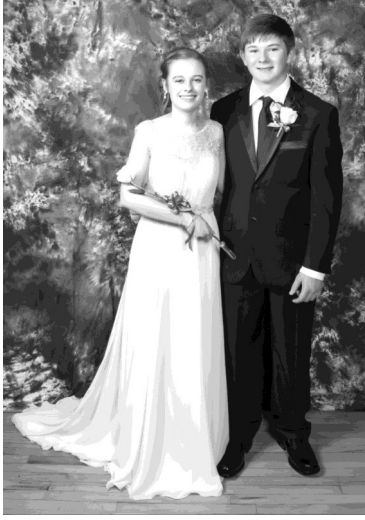

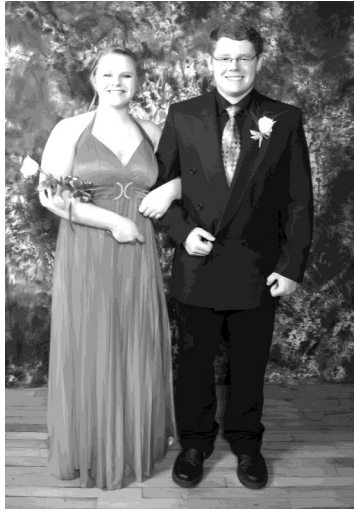


A great big "Thank You" goes to all who participated in the fall bookfair this year. The fair earned \$658.68 in Scholastic Dollars with which we will buy books for the library.

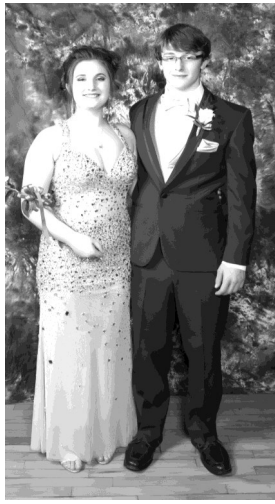




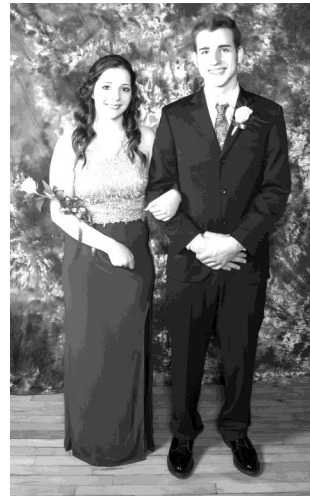

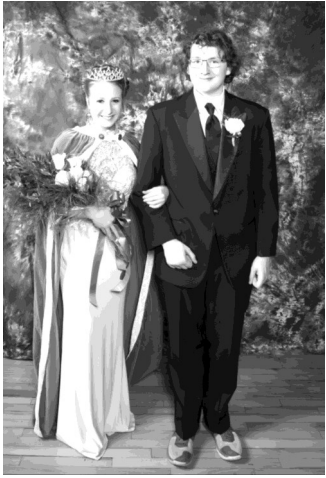

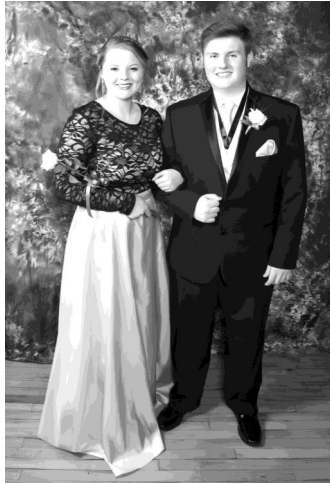

Using Sign Language in the Early Childhood Classroom

In the preschool classroom, we use sign language for nonverbal communication, which is useful in our fast-paced environment. If a teacher is with a group of students, and another student approaches with a question, the teacher can simply sign “yes”, “no”, or “wait”, without interrupting the flow of the lesson.

While sign language is a convenient communication tool, it also has many early developmental benefits. Here are a few!

- Children who sign are using both sides of their brain to process language!
- Sign language accommodates several learning styles, including verbal, kinesthetic, and interpersonal!
- Encourages awareness of social cues and gestures!
- Engages muscle memory - when children use sign language, they are using different senses which promotes memory retention!

After serving as the superintendent of the Salisbury school district for ten years, he taught in Saint Joseph as a math teacher for the 2016-17 school year and then came to North Harrison.

Steven, the Willhite's youngest son, is currently a sophomore at North Harrison. The oldest Willhite kids, Michael and Sarah, are students at Southwest Baptist University in Bolivar, MO.
